On behalf of the Caring Society, I am honoured to welcome you to the 15th Annual Caring Society Gala.

The Gala originated as an emergency fundraising effort when the Caring Society lost all government funding after co-filing, with the Assembly of First Nations (AFN), the human rights case for First Nations children at the Canadian Human Rights Tribunal. As many of you are aware, the case remains before the

Tribunal, as Canada has yet to submit sufficient evidence to demonstrate that it has ended its discrimination against First Nations children and taken measures to prevent its reocurrence. Most recently, Canada appealed a legal order (2025 CHRT 80) from the Tribunal that simply requires the federal government and the co-complainants, the Caring Society and AFN, to present a plan with evidence to permanently end Canada's discrimination against First Nations children outside of Ontario and to not apply a solution for Ontario to the rest of the country, which has different needs. The Caring Society strongly condemns Canada's appeal.

As 2025 draws to a close, it is truly uplifting to spend time in Manitoba among the agencies and other supporters who have stood with First Nations children from the beginning, and where the sacred gift of Jordan's Principle originates. 2025 is also the 20th anniversary of Jordan's Principle. Many of you in this room joined us earlier this year to celebrate Bear Witness Day at the beautiful event led by children and youth, hosted by Sagkeeng Child and Family Services and Kinosao Sipi Minisowin Agency (KSMA), in collaboration with the Anderson family. To all those joining us again tonight for the 15th Annual Gala, I am privileged to be in your company.

Lastly, I hope you will all join me in giving three cheers of appreciation to the KSMA for organizing the Gala again this year. KSMA has gone above and beyond in hosting four beautiful galas on behalf of the First Nations child welfare agencies of Manitoba to support equity for First Nations children. You make it look easy, but your hard work does not go unnoticed by any of us in the room tonight!


